








Irish Planning System An Overview

Planning Act






- Defines your functions in planning
- Obliges members and officials to act in long-term common good
- 277 Sections complex area of law we are obliged to providing training for you and officials on all/specific aspects
- Your authority's officials will carefully guide and advise you on specific aspects/questions



Noteworthy Sections of the Act

- Section 10: A development plan shall set out an overall strategy for proper planning and sustainable development
- Section 12(11) In making the development plan the members shall be restricted to considering the proper planning and sustainable development of the area...statutory obligations...relevant policies of the Government or any Minister
- Section 12(18) Statutory obligations includes that the development plan is consistent with the national and regional development objectives in the NPF and RSES
- Section 27(1) a planning authority shall ensure in making its development plan (or LAP)
 that it is consistent with the RSES

National Planning Framework (NPF)




- Government's high-level spatial policy to 2040
- Backed by capital investment
- Alignment between local plan-making and NPF and NDP secures funding
- Subject to updating at present
 - Incorporating Census 2022
 - Revised population/housing forecasts
 - Updated policy context








- Some encouraging signs...
 - Converging rates of population growth between Eastern and Midlands and N&W and Southern Regional Assembly areas
- Some further challenges
 - Location of housing delivery not matching location of demand
 - Stronger in-migration = increased housing targets






City Population Growth

- Growing (regional) cities at scale: key NPF challenge
- Census 2022 Waterford/Limerick stronger growth
- Overall "city" share of national population growth declined in Census 2022 to 32% from 2016 (46%)
- 35 towns increased > 1,000 persons
- 70%+ of above growth in city commuter belts of Dublin/Cork
- Implications for transport, services, emissions













- Link NPF & local planning

- Review/Update will follow NPF update








Output and implications of assessments


- (a) **Observations** & (b) **Recommendations**...necessary to ensure effective coordination of national, regional and local planning....
- OPR <u>recommendations</u> must be addressed and any decision not to comply must be notified to the OPR and reasons given...
- Observations/recommendations are <u>intended to guide you in making a plan compliant</u>
 with legal and policy requirements...
- Recommendations not implemented <u>where key policy breaches arise can result in</u>
 <u>recommendations to the Minister</u> to issue Directions to rectify...

2024 P&D Bill: Key Changes re Plans









Policy Directives issued by the Minister for Housing, Local Government and Heritage under S.29 (2)

2024 Planning Bill

The Minister may issue (subject to Govt approval) a National Planning Statement (NPS) containing:

- "National Planning Policies and Measures" to support proper planning and sustainable development; and
- "National Planning Policy Guidance" providing guidance on the implementation of the above.
- Will provide for clearer framework for policy-making at local level


2024 Planning Bill

Regional Spatial and Economic Strategies (RSES)



- Enhanced coordination functions in respect of a wider range of planning strategies and policies across county boundaries.
- Enhanced role for Assemblies in coordinating plan-making functions for towns straddling boundaries.
- RSES's must be consistent with the NPF,
 National Marine Planning Framework and
 National Planning Policies and Measures

Development Plans



2024 Planning Bill

Key Changes:

- Next plans must contain six thematic strategies:
 - 1. Sustainable Development and Regeneration
 - 2. Economic Development
 - 3. Housing Development
 - 4. Sustainable Places and Communities
 - 5. Environment and Climate Change
 - 6. Conservation of Natural and Built Heritage
- Zoning objectives to be indicated across the full functional area
- 10 year lifespan, review Year 5 policy and data alignment (census)
- OPR role in development plans streamlined Minister remains final arbiter on issuing final Direction (OPR may issue draft direction)
- Minister, subject to Government approval and OPR consultation, may issue an urgent Direction to vary a development plan within a specified period, making provision for class of infrastructure or other development of national or strategic importance (emergency provision).

Local Area Plans



2024 Planning Bill

Replaced by 3 types of plans for specific circumstances:

- Urban Area Plans for RSES regional growth centres and key towns where the scale of growth requires an integrated approach to planning.
- Priority Area Plans for parts of cities/towns with capacity to deliver significant housing or other development or needing bespoke regeneration.
- Coordinated Area Plans: prepared by two or more planning authorities for settlements or parts of settlement straddling boundaries as identified in RSES.

Area Plans to be consistent with the relevant development plan and, for Coordinated Area Plans, with each of the relevant development plans.

Provisions of area plans conflicting with development plans will not have effect (to ensure effective coordination).

- Local planning policies need to address the issues in your communities...
- While also addressing legislatively determined strategies...
- Plan-making: a balancing process...
- Well-thought out plans balancing local and strategic issues will attract investment and give a clear basis for robust decision-making by your CE and national bodies in support of the plan you make...
